


### **Wednesday Maintenance of Way Update**

### **Saturday Maintenance of Way Update**

Saturday MOW

I always think that the thought of "rain" induces fears about being cold and wet, so must be the case of MOW days when the weatherman hints of rain. However, as it

turns out, some of the best work days are on so-called rainy days as the temperature is cool and the rain usually cooperates. Saturday, April 7<sup>th</sup> was no exception as the crew of 5 including Bill Ross, Chris O'Gara, Steve Hill, Frank Fontes, and Mike Strider, completed two ma-

fect weather conditions. In the morning, we loaded the stake truck with track tools, along with the CASE backhoe, and headed for Happy Valley bridge near MP 39. In preparation for the final inspection on the bridge and the

planned installation of 132-lb rail, the existing 90-lb rail and approach track was removed and the materials were stacked nearby. This was completed just after lunch. Once the track was removed, the crew headed to the new Verona Spur were we spent the rest of the afternoon spread-

ing base rock and raising the track in preparation for ballast. Jeff Haslam joined the crew in the afternoon to help with the Verona Spur.

The next step at Verona is to sur-

face both mainline and spur including the switch with ballast so that we can open up these two portions for both MOW and train operations. The mainline eastward construction will start to see some activity in the next couple of months. Next month Steve Jones will lead the charge and re-

move overhanging vegetation in the curve leading up to Happy Valley bridge so the Burro Crane can freely handle track panels as we build east. Steve Barkkarie will be reclaiming ballast with our ballast shaker as he works east now that we have all the outset markers established

for the horizontal portion of the track alignment.

We should be getting fair weather from now until next winter, so come out on the first Saturday of the month and join the fun.

#### **BRUSH WORLD**

It has been said that the trees and brush that reside alongside of our right-of-way grow 24/7, but we only have the fourth Saturday of each month to cut them back. Well, first, I don't think they actually grow while the sun is down, but I'm pretty sure they are plotting. Because of track space conflicts with the Train of Lights, we don't go out on the ROW to trim trees in November or December, so that's only 10 Saturdays out of 365 days a year to keep the track side vegetation from taking yours truly to remove branches close

over and holding us hostage.

The first Saturday of the month is traditionally dedicated to new track construction at the East end of the line. The first Saturday in May found Chief Engineer Mike Strider out of the state, so he ceded track construction to Brush Cutting. We took the opportunity to test the versatility of our new custom-built Bandit Chip-

per off-rail. We rented a small dump truck and towed the 8,000 pound chipper to the far East end of track to trim trees which would interfere with future track construction. Vol-

unteers who participated in this historic event included John Pelmulder, Ron Thomas, Ed Best, Dan Mills, Dee Murphy, Brian Hitchcock, Bob Bailey, Brooke Murphy and the undersigned. Dan Sarka photodocumented the occasion.

In an effort to regain the upper hand, we have begun to experiment with a "Second Wednesday" brush cutting day in addition to our customary 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday. On Wednes- 1988 on special excursion runs from day May 10<sup>th</sup>, the crew of Dee Murphy and Doug Vanderlee joined

enough to the tracks to touch passing main line equipment from the Shoofly to the Verona Crossing. Due to technical difficulties, our new

chipper was in the shop, so all slash was stacked for chipping the next week.

This stretch of right-of-way is not normally used for public operations, but will be part of the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the Pacific Locomotive Association in Niles Canyon. The M200 will take returning pioneers who built the first tracks from Brightside to Sunol in 1986 to Sunol to the Verona Crossing.

On Wednesday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, the whole Wednesday gang con-
